

## Kent Scouts Campcraft



These are the rules and conditions you need to abide by on the campsite

Choose suitable clothing, footwear & emergency equipment and how to use it. Choose appropriate camping gear and care for it.

Pack a rucksack, waterproofing the contents, always keeping the weight down to a minimum and never more than 25% of your bodyweight.

Choose a campsite and know the arrangements for water, cooking and sanitation.

Pitch, use & strike tens safely and sensibly. Tents should be pitched to ensure people don't fall over the guy ropes. Tents need to be pitched appropriate to conditions of the weather and site

Know and use the safety procedures & precautions which must be observed when using stoves & handling fuel. Cooking MUST be carried out at least 4 metres (12 feet) away from all tents. Stoves must be used safely (on the floor) not raised where the risk of tipping and scalding participants is increased.

Cook appropriate meals under camp conditions - see menu card for more information.

Washing up should be carried out at either designated washing up facilities or preferably on your campsite area. Washing up must never be done under a campsite water tap as this leads to muddy unhygienic mess for all

Campsite must be left clean, tidy and free from rubbish. Participants should either dispose of rubbish in appropriate main rubbish bins or remove their rubbish from site when they depart.

No open fires or campfires are permitted on County DofE events.
